HELP protect the environment & your community from tire fires & water borne diseases— recycle scrap passenger vehicle tires— FREE

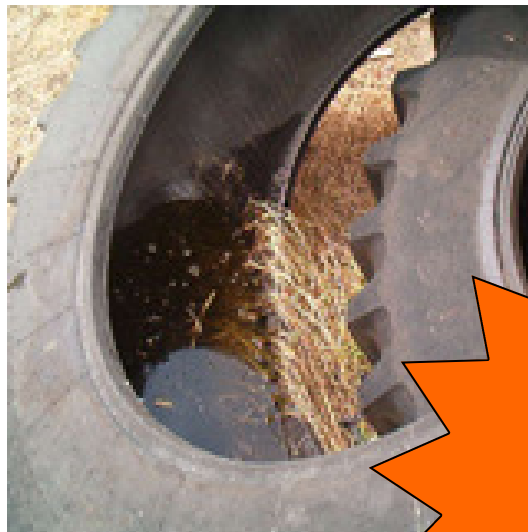
Dates/Times & Locations

All events will take place from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm on the following Saturdays:

- April 22, 2017 at the City of Muskegon DPW
- May 13, 2017 at Fruitport Township Hall
- June 3, 2017 at Laketon Township's Mullally Park
- June 10, 2017 at Whitehall High School
- July 22, 2017 at Cedar Creek Township Hall

REQUIREMENTS:

- Be a Muskegon County Resident
- Passenger vehicle tires are taken FREE of charge—up to 34 inches in diameter.
- Tires can be taken with or without rims
- NO COMMERCIAL businesses will be permitted to dispose of tires at this event—this event is for RESIDENTS ONLY. Per DEQ policy, commercial haulers must have a permit to transport more than 7 tires per vehicle load.



Water in scrap tires creates a breeding ground for mosquitoes—which spread diseases such as: West Nile virus, heartworms, various types of encephalitis, and zika
